### Outlook to 2019: Migration Project

For 2019, we are planning a major change to our technical infrastructure which will make sure that clients can take advantage of a range of DOI services and tools developed by DataCite. DOI clients that register their DOIs manually will be offered a new user interface for DOI registration, while clients that register their DOIs automatically will have the option of switching to DataCite's DOI registration API, if they wish. We will contact all clients well in advance before the migration starts, so stay tuned!
